The kingdom

The Kingdom of the Netherlands is made up of four autonomous countries: Aruba, Curaçao, Sint Maarten and the Netherlands. The Netherlands has a European part with 12 provinces and a Caribbean part consisting of the islands Bonaire, Saba and St. Eustatius.

Just like the regions in the European Netherlands, the Caribbean regions are responsible for the well-being and welfare of their citizens and enterprises. BBB feels that – taking into account the relatively independent positions of the islands – this responsibility is a shared one. BBB feels that – like the countryside in the European Netherlands – the Caribbean part of the Kingdom deserves more attention. The islands are more than a holiday destination! In an entrepreneurial sense too, much can be gained in the fields of well-being and welfare from more cooperation within the Kingdom. We can get more out of the Trans-Atlantic connections that we share.

This shared responsibility calls for a more refined administrative cooperation. The conditions on the Caribbean islands are different from those in the European Netherlands and these differences should be respected on an administrative level. We acknowledge those differences full of optimism and look forward to a closer cooperation, with respect for the differences and for the autonomy of the parts of the Kingdom.

The autonomous Caribbean parts of the Kingdom can make their own decisions in many areas of policy making. The Central Government will keep its role in ensuring fundamental human rights, justice, proper administration. Together, we can take up the challenge to shape the democracy on the islands with reliable justice as a given. BBB is committed to this.
